

# MOSSER HOLZINDUSTRIE SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR LOG SUPPLY

# 1. General

Traffic regulations and a speed limit of 30 km/h apply across the entire business premises of Mosser Holzindustrie.

Plant traffic has priority (log transporters, forklift trucks).

The wearing of high-vis clothing and safety shoes is mandatory on the business premises of Mosser Holzindustrie. Protective clothing must be put on before leaving trucks.

Vehicles on the plant site must always be parked in such a way that traffic routes can be used without restriction.

Smoking and the consumption of alcohol are strictly forbidden at Mosser Holzindustrie.

It is forbidden to bring external parties on to the plant site of Mosser Holzindustrie (except log suppliers coming to collect logs as per prior arrangement)

Access to the production areas of Mosser Holzindustrie is not permitted.

### 2. Unloading

Instructions given to employees working in the log yard (sorters, transporter drivers) absolutely must be followed.

It is strictly forbidden to stop in the area directly next to the log sorting area (log handling area, danger of falling trunks).



Logs must be unloaded directly to the log sorting area unless explicitly assigned to temporary storage by plant staff.

Unloading must generally be carried out unassisted.

If, in exceptional cases, unloading is carried out (without crane) by a log transporter, the instructions of the transporter driver must be obeyed. During the unloading process itself, visual contact and/or a suitable safety distance from the unloading vehicle must be maintained – the person guiding the vehicle must operate from a safe location in all cases.

#### 3. Instruction

The freight company undertakes to instruct its employees in these principles of conduct and regarding the applicable safety regulations.

# 4. Sanctioning

Our employees in the log yard are required to alert deliverers to any breaches and to demand compliance with the safety regulations.

In the case of serious breaches and/or repeated violations of the safety regulations, an access ban may be imposed.
